
Yearwise comparison of persondays generated under MGNREGA, in Jalpaiguri District




Comparative statement of Employment Generated under MGNREGA for the year 2008-09 L 2009-10




Yearwise comparison of no. of household provided 100 days of employment under MGNREGA, in Jalpaiguri






YEAR WISE COMPARATIVE STATE OF PER GP








Yearwise comparison of average no. of days employment provided under MGNREGA, in Jalpaiguri District






Approved Sectorwise Schemes for the year 2009-10


